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## **Interviewer Instructions for Administering the Parent Questionnaire**

### **In-home Study**

**Parent interview.** The mother (or other female head of the household) of the originally sampled adolescent will be asked to participate in a 40-minute interviewer-administered, paper-and-pencil survey regarding health status and behaviors of the adolescent, home environment, and her interpersonal relationships. The parent survey instrument does not contain highly sensitive items about the parent, however it does ask some sensitive questions about the adolescent. The adolescent's mother (or other female head of the household) is the desired respondent to complete the questionnaire because, according to the results of previous studies, mothers are generally more familiar than fathers with the schooling, health status, and health behaviors of their children.

### **Identifying the Parent Survey Respondent**

Upon your arrival at the household, ask to speak to the student's mother—the preferred respondent to complete the parent questionnaire. If the student's mother does not reside in the household, the appropriate respondent is the first person on the following list who lives with the student:

1. Stepmother
2. Other female guardian, such as a legal guardian or grandmother
3. Father
4. Stepfather
5. Other male guardian, such as a legal guardian or grandfather

*Do not schedule an interview with a male respondent out of convenience.* If the mother, stepmother, or other female guardian lives with the adolescent but is unavailable at the time of your visit, ask your household contact for the best time to reach her. If the preferred female resident refuses to be interviewed, the adolescent's father, stepfather, or other male guardian may act as respondent.

### **Conducting the Parent Interview**

The parent questionnaire is a standard, interviewer-administered, pencil-and-paper instrument with show cards. You should strictly adhere to the general administration rules of standard interviewing procedures learned in general training. It is critical that you maintain a professional demeanor and tone throughout the administration of the parent questionnaire. It is also critical that the interview be conducted in a private setting free from interruption. These procedures are necessary to avoid biasing responses, and to make the parent feel at ease when answering sensitive questions about his or her adolescent.

When possible, the parent interview should be administered during the Audio-CASI portion of the adolescent interview. Skip patterns and interviewer instructions in the parent instrument will help you navigate the respondent through the various sections of the questionnaire. You should be well-versed in the criteria for administering sections before conducting your first parent interview. You should also be thoroughly familiar with the question-by-question specifications for the parent questionnaire, which will be provided at training.

If more than one adolescent resides in the household, you will need to complete a parent questionnaire continuation booklet for each additional, eligible adolescent.

## Parent Questionnaire Structure

The questionnaire consists of four sections; any given respondent will complete at least two sections.

- Section A. **Core Questions.** This section consists of demographic and health-related questions and is administered to all parent respondents.
- Section B. **Current Spouse or Partner.** This section is administered if the respondent is: (1) married and living with the spouse; (2) married, not living with the spouse, but living in a marriage-like relationship with someone else; or (3) not married, but living in a marriage-like relationship.
- Section C. **Child-Specific Questions.** This section is administered for each adolescent eligible for the in-home adolescent survey. In addition to general demographic questions about the adolescent, this section also asks for the parent's opinions on the adolescent's social life, friends and health experiences and conditions.
- Section D. **Twin.** The section is only administered to parents of twins. Be sure to complete a continuation booklet for the second twin.

## **Parent Questionnaire Introductory Notes**

### **Section A**

1. When using variable PA1, respondent's sex, be sure to cross check this variable with PC1, relationship to the adolescent, and PD5, person who filled out the core and child specific sections of the questionnaire. There are instances of male mothers, female fathers, etc., and these three variables, along with questions 2-9 in the Child Specific Section, need to be taken into consideration when determining who filled out the different sections of the questionnaire. A cross tabulation of PA1 and PC1 indicates that there are 339 male mother figures and 45 female father figures. Upon closer examination you can see that 157 of the male mother figures live with the biological father of the respondent and report the sex of the spouse or partner as male, suggesting that variable PA1 should be recoded to indicate that the respondent for the Parent Questionnaire was female since the same person filled out the core and the child specific sections.

### **Section C**

1. When using variable PC1, relationship to the adolescent, be sure to read Section A, Note 1.
