

## **MAT1332: Calculus for the Life Sciences II**

**Textbook:** Calculus for the Life Sciences: Modelling the Dynamics of Life by Frederick Adler and Miroslav Lovric, with two add-on modules: Linear Algebra and Functions of Several Variables.

**Content:** Integrals, differential equations, complex numbers, linear algebra, multivariable calculus, stability in linear and nonlinear systems.

**Assessment:** Weekly assignments (10%), two midterms (40%), final exam (50%). Late assignments will not be accepted. There will be no makeup tests. Any student who scores less than 40% on the final exam will receive an automatic F, regardless of their marks in assignments or midterms. Any student who scores less than 45% on the final exam cannot receive a higher grade than an E.

**Midterm dates:** February 15, 2017 and March 29, 2017

**Life Sciences Penalty:** To incorporate the “Life Sciences” part of the course, in addition to biologically motivated problems, there will be a penalty for biologically incorrect statements that are obviously and verifiably false.

**Blackboard Learn:** Please ensure you are registered in the course and in the correct section. All assignments, lecture notes and other announcements will be communicated through Blackboard Learn. It is your responsibility to check for announcements.

**Calculators:** Only the faculty-approved calculators (TI-30X, TI-34X, Casio FX-260X and Casio FX-300X, where X can be replaced by any letters) are permitted on midterms and the final. Any other calculator found during the midterm or final exam will be confiscated.

Re-grading can only be done by this method. Please do not approach me or your TA during class times to discuss grade changes. Once one week has passed after you have turned in your paragraph and the original assignment, you can come to the next office hour to discuss your grade.
