A 17-year-old man died in a car crash. He'd had life insurance since he was one year old. One business day after receiving the required information, London Life paid \$34,000 to his beneficiary, his father.

A 25-year-old man died of accidental drowning. He'd had life insurance since he was born. One business day after receiving the required information, London Life paid \$15,000 to his beneficiaries, his mother and father.

A 34-year-old man died of cancer. Five business days after receiving the required information, London Life paid \$100,000 to his beneficiary, his wife.

A 37-year-old woman died in a motor vehicle accident. She'd had her life insurance policy for five years. Two business days after receiving the required information, London Life paid \$344,200 to her beneficiary, her husband.

A 40-year-old man died in a motor vehicle accident. Five business days after London Life received the required information, it paid \$100,000 to his beneficiaries, his son and daughter.

A 44-year-old woman died of cancer. She'd had her life insurance policy for six years. One business day after London Life received the required information, it paid \$500,000 to her beneficiary, her husband.

A 55-year-old man died of cancer. One business day after receiving the required information, London Life paid \$300,000 to his beneficiary, his business.

A 65-year-old man died of cancer. He'd had his life insurance policy for seven years. One business day after receiving the required information, London Life paid \$55,000 to his beneficiary, his wife.

A 79-year-old woman died of natural causes. Four business days after receiving the required information, London Life paid \$168,000 to her beneficiaries, her three children.

An 85-year-old man died of cancer. One business day after receiving the required information, London Life paid \$100,000 to his beneficiary, his wife.
